- 4. While a First Class Scout, take part in <u>service projects</u> totaling at least 6 hours of work. These projects must be approved by your Scoutmaster.
- 5. While a First Class Scout, serve <u>actively</u> 4 months in one or more of the following positions of responsibility (or carry out a Scoutmaster-assigned leadership project to help the troop):

Boy Scout troop. Patrol leader, Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Venture Patrol Leader, Troop Guide, Order of the Arrow troop representative, Den Chief, Scribe, Librarian, Historian, Quartermaster, Bugler, Junior Assistant Scoutmaster, Chaplain Aide, Instructor, troop Webmaster, or Leave No Trace Trainer.

Varsity Scout team. Captain, Cocaptain, Program Manager, Squad Leader, Team Secretary, Order Of The Arrow Team Representative, Librarian, Historian, Quartermaster, Chaplain Aide, Instructor, Den Chief, team Webmaster, or Leave No Trace Trainer.

Venturing crew / Sea Scout ship. President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Den Chief, Quartermaster, Historian, Guide, Boatswain, Boatswain's Mate, Yeoman, Purser, Storekeeper, or crew/ship Webmaster, or Leave No Trace Trainer.

- 6. Take part in a <u>Scoutmaster conference</u>.
- 7. Complete your board of review.
